## Regulating FinTech; "Proposals for a Distributed Ledger Technology (DLT) Regulatory Framework"

HM Government of Gibraltar confirms that it will today publish for public consultation the above captioned document. The consultation period runs up to and including 6<sup>th</sup> June 2017.

Albert Isola, Minister for Commerce commented, "This Government made a public commitment to widely consult with the private sector and other interested parties on its vision to establish and develop Gibraltar as a centre of excellence in the innovative financial technology sector. I am pleased to advise that, working closely with the Gibraltar Financial Services Commission, and the private sector Cryptocurrency Working Group we have produced a comprehensive document providing a detailed template on how we believe this should happen.

This morning the Government is a co-sponsor of the Digital Currency Summit hosted at the University of Gibraltar. This summit has brought to Gibraltar many significant players in the technology sector from overseas and we welcome the opportunity to exchange views on the proposed Gibraltar regulatory framework. As always, we welcome and encourage as much feedback as is possible to allow us to give due regard to your views and develop a world leading framework in this new and exciting area of opportunity. I would like to publicly acknowledge and thank the many people that have contributed to and supported this process over the last 2 years and look forward to driving this to implementation in the coming months."

The Gibraltar Financial Services Commission will be hosting a clinic on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> May 2017 at the University of Gibraltar between 10am and 12pm to provide further detailed information on this consultation.
