The Gibraltar Museum wins Film Festival Award with a short film on the Gorham's Cave Complex UNESCO World Heritage Site

The Gibraltar Museum has won the Festival Award at the recent Twickenham Alive Film Festival 2016 with a short film showcasing the Gorham's Cave Complex UNESCO World Heritage Site. The five minute film was submitted following the inscription of the Gorham's Cave Complex in the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites in July 2016.
